Dementia Live® is an experience that immerses participants into what life might be like living with cognitive impairment and sensory change. CGNE offers training opportunities to gero faculty and staff to then provide this unique, hands-on learning activity to students. To date, 33 faculty + **Staff** across 6 campuses have participated, with 6 people trained as coaches in 2024.
